

## Dealing with Disappointment

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"—Luke 24:32

How long will this COVID-19 thing last? When will people get to go back to work? How are small businesses going to make it? How long can the church survive online? Is this the end of the world as we know it? Is Jesus coming back? And what about me... when will my life get back to normal?

These are just some of the questions I hear people asking as their freedoms are shrinking in the midst of our current crisis. That said, is it okay to acknowledge, for just a minute, that most if not all of us are disappointed at some level about the disruption we are experiencing?

Many of us have had vacation plans, weddings to crash, birthday parties to attend and anniversaries to celebrate. And then there's the fact that we can't meet to worship together face-to-face (Easter was a tough one!). While there have been many creative ideas such as drive-by honking parties, parking lot worship and pan bashing acknowledgements for the sacrificial work of our medical professionals, the disappointment is real.

In a way, the disappointment is not unlike what the first disciples might have felt after the kangaroo trial and execution of Jesus on Good Friday. It probably seemed like the end of the world for those who put all their stock in Jesus. This is so clearly seen in the confusion and dashed hopes of the two men walking on the road to Emmaus: Jesus was our way out. How could this happen? What do we do now that He is gone?

And then, out of nowhere, the resurrected yet unrecognizable Jesus shows up and walks alongside them. And even though He chides them for their unbelief, Jesus didn't rail on them for their disappointment. He let them sit with it as He opened up the Scriptures to the sad pair. It wasn't until He broke bread with them that they got it. There was no fanfare from Jesus. Just a deep burning in the hearts of these two friends that their hope was not

in vain. Jesus met them right where they were and where they needed Him most and then left to let them sort it out.

May I suggest that no matter what the crisis or how severe it may be, Jesus is right in the middle of it with you? He has no interest in beating you over the head with your restlessness or disappointments. But He will let you sit with it. He does want to provide a place of rest for your soul *now* so that when this crisis has passed you will be able to sort things out in the *future* with a peace that lasts.

Friends, I don't know when this crisis will end, but I do know a Saviour who can and will lead me through it, disappoints and all. How about you?
