Thanksgiving is a very important subject in the Bible. There is no shortage of scriptures on the subject in the Old Testament and in the New Testament. The Book of Psalms, in particular, is full of such verses on thanksgiving. **Psalm 95:2** says, "Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving; let us shout joyfully to Him with psalms" (New King James Version).

The Bible says in Psalm 107:21-22, "Oh, that men would give thanks to the LORD for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men! Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare His works with rejoicing" (New King James Version). In Psalm 116:17, it is

written: "I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving, and will call upon the name of the LORD" (New King James Version).

The psalmist says in **Psalm 147:7**, "**Sing to the LORD with thanksgiving; sing praises on the harp to our God**" (New King James Version). Psalm 50:14 says, "Offer to God thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High" (New King James Version). This is just to mention a few.

The New Testament also contains similar verses on thanksgiving, such as **Colossians 4:2**, which enjoins believers to **"continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving" (New King James Version). Ephesians 5:20** says to give thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In view of the important attention given to thanksgiving in the Bible, it is a worthwhile exercise to consider its benefits, in order to encourage believers to pay serious attention to thanksgiving. From the Word of God, I've been able to identify ten benefits of thanksgiving to Christians. And I believe God that this message will impact positively your fellowship will God towards engaging more in robust thanksgiving.
